ORDINANCE No. 31 of 1950.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Prison Ordinance, 1929, by making provision to bring up prisoners before the Court of Criminal Appeal.

[7th October, 1950.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Prison (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be construed and read as one with the Prison Ordinance, 1929, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein after the words "interest of justice" of the words "or in pursuance of any order of the Court of Criminal Appeal or of any Judge thereof,".
