ORDINANCE No. 33 of 1950.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Cinematograph (British Films) Ordinance, 1933.

[7th October, 1950.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, A.D. 1950. with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cinematograph (British Films) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be construed and read as one with the Cinematograph (British Films) Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. Short title.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of the definition of the expression "British film" and the substitution therefor of the following definition — Amend-

" "British film" means any film depicting scenes intended for exhibition by a cinematograph apparatus which has been shown to have been registered as a British film under the Cinematograph Films Act, 1927, or the Cinematograph Films Acts, 1938 and 1948 by the production of a certified copy of the entry relating to such film in the register kept by the Board of Trade under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts." 17 & 18
