ORDINANCE No. 35 of 1950.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance.

[7th October, 1950.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

A.D. 1950.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be construed and read as one with the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Short title.

Cap. 107.

2. Subsection (1) of section ninety-eight of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor —

Repeal and re-enactment of subsection (1) of section 98 of the Principal Ordinance.

“Licences in respect of the Transport and Harbours Department and the airport at Atkinson Field.

98. (1) The Governor in Council may authorise the District Commissioner to issue a licence —
- (a) to the General Manager of the Transport and Harbours Department or to such person as may be nominated by that Department in respect of the sale of intoxicating liquor at any station or in any train or in any steamer of the Department; or
  - (b) to any person in respect of the sale of intoxicating liquor at the airport at Atkinson Field.”
