ORDINANCE No. 36 of 1950.

AN ORDINANCE to allow and confirm certain additional expenditure incurred in the year ended the thirty-first day of December, 1949.

[7th October, 1950.]

WHEREAS expenditure was necessarily incurred during the year ended on the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine on certain services approved by the Legislative Council on Supplementary Estimate but not provided for by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1949.

Be it, therefore, enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—
