ORDINANCE No. 42 of 1950.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, with respect to the time for the exercise of the option to accept a gratuity and a reduced pension; to make better provision in respect of officers killed or injured while travelling on duty by air; and to afford officers to whom the provisions of the Pensions Ordinance apply a further opportunity to elect that the provisions of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, shall apply to them.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment No. 3) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be construed and read as one with the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

6. For the purposes of the Principal Ordinance, any person holding office in the service of the Government of Palestine immediately before the fifteenth day of May, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, shall be deemed to continue in his office until either he is again appointed to hold office in the public service, or, if he is not so appointed, he retires or is removed from office.
