(4) Members of the Special Reserve shall not be regarded as workmen for the purposes of the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance or any amending Ordinance.

Regulations. 123.O. (1) The Commissioner may, with the approval of the Governor in Council make Regulations providing for the discipline of members of the Special Reserve when called out for service and generally for all the purposes of this Part of this Ordinance.

(2) There may be annexed to any regula-

tion for the breach thereof -

(a) in the case of an officer, suspension from pay and duty, pending the decision of the

Governor; and

(b) in the case of non-commissioned officer or constable, suspension without pay for any period not exceeding twenty-eight days, or a fine not exceeding ten days' pay, or confinement to barracks for a period not exceeding seven days.

An Ordinance futher to amend the Coconut Products (Control) Ordinance, 1935, by the repeal of those provisions relating to Copra Brokers and by the abolition of the Copra Brokers Board.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Repeal of certain sections of the Principal Ordinance.

Amendment of subsection (1) of section 29 of the Principal Ordinance. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Coconut Products (Control) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1950, and shall be construed and read as one with the Coconut Products (Control) Ordinance, 1935, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Sections six to nine inclusive, sections twelve to nineteen inclusive, subsection (2) of section twenty-four, section twenty-five and section twenty-seven of the Principal Ordinance are hereby repealed.

3. Subsection (1) of section twenty-nine of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "or brokers' premises".
