BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 11 OF 1951.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Customs Ordinance.

A.D. 1951

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Customs Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same. Short title.

Amendment of section 184 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section one hundred and eighty-four of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended —

- (a) by the substitution for the words “any cart, wagon or other conveyance,” and the words “smuggled goods” in subsection (1) of the words “any vehicle”, and “smuggled or uncustomed goods” respectively;
- (b) by the substitution for the words “cart, wagon or other conveyance” in subsection (2) of the word “vehicle”; and
- (c) by the addition thereto of the following subsection —
 - “(3) In this section the expression “uncustomed goods” means any goods on which the full duties have not been paid or which are imported or exported or in any way dealt with contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance or the Customs Duties Ordinance.”

Amendment of the First Schedule to the Principal Ordinance.

3. The First Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following item —

“13. Live fish of any species not indigenous to the Colony except in accordance with a licence granted by the Director of Agriculture.”
