BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 14 of 1951

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, A.D. 1951- with respect to the pensions of Public Officers who have service as Teachers.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amend- Short title. ment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Repeal and re-enactment of section 11A of the Principal Ordinance. No. 7 of 1948.

2. Section 11A of the Principal Ordinance as enacted by section two of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor —

“Officers with service as teachers. Cap. 197.

11A. Where the service of a public officer has been preceded by service as a teacher in a school within the meaning of the Teachers Pensions Ordinance, such service as a teacher shall be taken into account in computing pension or gratuity under this Ordinance: Provided that such service as a teacher is not reckoned in the computation of pension payable to the officer under the Teachers Pensions Ordinance.”

Amendment of the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance.

3. Sub-regulation (2) of regulation ten of the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance as enacted by section three of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, is hereby amended by the deletion of the word “pensionable” in the fourth and fifth lines, and by the substitution for the words “shall be deemed to be service paid for out of an open vote” of the words “shall be taken into account in computing pension or gratuity”.

Commencement.

4. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have had effect from the first day of January, nineteen hundred and forty-eight.
