## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 15 of 1951.

AN ORDINANCE further to extend the duration of the New A.D. 1951  
Amsterdam Electric Lighting Order, 1900.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with  
the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as  
follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the New Amsterdam Short title.  
Electric Lighting Order (Extension) Ordinance, 1951.

2. In this Ordinance —

“the Order” means the New Amsterdam Electric Lighting Order, 1900;

“the Principal Ordinance” means the Electric Lighting Ordinance.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) of section five of the Principal Ordinance, the Order, as amended from time to time, and extended by the Electric Lighting Ordinance, 1932, for a period of twenty years from the twenty-third day of August, nineteen hundred and thirty, shall continue to have effect and shall be deemed always to have continued to have effect as though an extension of the Order as amended had been granted by the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (e) of section five of the Principal Ordinance for the period commencing on the twenty-third day of August, nineteen hundred and fifty, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-one.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (e) of section five of the Principal Ordinance, the Governor in Council may, from time to time by notice published in the *Gazette*, further extend the duration of the Order until the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-two.
