BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 23 OF 1951.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Bakeries (Hours of Work) Ordinance, 1946.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with A.D. 1951. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Bakeries (Hours of Work) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and read as one with the Bakeries (Hours of Work) Ordinance, 1946, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Repeal and re-enactment of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section three of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor —

“Restriction of working hours in bakeries.

3. Subject to the provisions of sections four and four A of this Ordinance, no person shall manufacture bread or flour confectionery in any bakery or engage in any work incidental thereto —

- (a) on any Sunday, except in the work of setting sponge; or
- (b) between the hour of seven in the evening of any day (except Friday) and the hour of five in the morning of the succeeding day, except in the work of setting the sponge, dough making and oven firing; or
- (c) for more than sixty hours in any week.”.

New section 4A inserted in the Principal Ordinance.

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby further amended by the insertion therein after section four of the following new section —

“Power of the Commissioner of Labour to modify the restrictions imposed by section 3.

4A. The Commissioner of Labour may, where he considers it desirable, so to do by reason of any breakdown of machinery, or plant or other unforeseen emergency, permit the employment of any person in a bakery in the manufacture of bread or flour confectionery between the hour of seven in the evening of any day and the hour of five in the morning of the following day for any period not exceeding two weeks.”.

Amendment of Section 8 (1) of the Principal Ordinance.

4. Subsection (1) of section eight of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein after the words “made under section four” of the words “or the provisions of section four A”.
