BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 38 of 1951.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1935.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of British Guiana, with A.D. 1951. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties Short
(Amendment No. 3) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be construed and title.
read as one with the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1935, hereinafter No. 23 of
referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance 1935.
amending the same.

Amendment of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended —

(a) by re-numbering subsection (2) as subsection (3); and

(b) by the insertion of the following as subsection (2) —
 “ (2) The Governor in Council may in his discretion by order remit or cause to be refunded the whole or any portion of any customs duties payable or paid in respect of any goods under the provisions of this section”.

Amendment of section 4 (2) of the Principal Ordinance.

3. Subsection (2) of section four of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end thereof and by the addition thereto of the following proviso —

“ Provided that the Comptroller may in his discretion in the case of goods brought into the Colony by air, reduce the amount of freight charges to be taken into account in fixing the value of such goods for the purposes of this section to such sum as he may think fit, not being less than one-fourth of the freight charges actually payable in respect of such goods. ”

Amendment of the Second Schedule to the Principal Ordinance. No. 25 of 1944.

4. The Second Schedule to the Principal Ordinance as substituted by the Customs Duties (Amendment No. 2) (Consolidation of Schedules) Ordinance, 1944, is hereby further amended by the insertion therein after item 17 of the following new item —

Amendment of the Third Schedule to the Principal Ordinance. No. 25 of 1944.

5. The Third Schedule to the Principal Ordinance as substituted by the Customs Duties (Amendment No. 2) (Consolidation of Schedules) Ordinance, 1944, is hereby further amended by the insertion in item 9 after the words “all other materials” of the following —

“(except printing paper otherwise than as previously specified in this item)”.

Amendment of the Fourth Schedule to the Principal Ordinance. No. 25 of 1944

6. The Fourth Schedule to the Principal Ordinance as substituted by the Customs Duties (Amendment No. 2) (Consolidation of Schedules) Ordinance, 1944, is hereby further amended —

(a) by the substitution for sub-item (12) of item 1 of the following sub-item —

“(12) Goods of a non-consumable nature imported solely for use in the construction, repair, furnishing or decoration of places of worship, vestments, altar-bread and altar-wine, to the satisfaction of the Comptroller as to kind and quantity of such goods and the purpose for which they have been imported, and on the signed declaration of the head of the denomination for which such goods are intended that they will be used solely for the purposes stated therein:

Provided that the provisions of this sub-item shall apply only to such religious denominations as may be approved by the Governor in Council;

(b) by the substitution for sub-item (27) of item 1 of the following sub-item —

“(27) paperware of the following description; almanacs, signed bank notes, plans, photographs (not including frames therefor), postage stamps, used or unused, used post cards”;

(c) by the substitution for item 2 of the following item —

“2. Articles of an educational, scientific or cultural nature of the following description, to the satisfaction of the Comptroller as to their description and use:

(1) books, documents (printed or produced by duplicating processes, but excluding stationery), periodicals, newspapers, manuscripts (including typescripts), musical compositions, maps, charts;

(2) paintings and drawings (excluding manufactured wares), hand-painted impressions signed and numbered by the artist, original works of art of statuary or sculpture; collectors' pieces and objects of art consigned to approved public galleries, museums and other public institutions and not intended for re-sale; antiques more than one hundred years old;


(3) films, slides and sound recordings;

(4) articles specially designed for the use of the blind; and

(d) by the substitution for sub-item (8) of item 5 of the following sub-item —

“(8) ingredients for use in the manufacture of candles, soap, edible oils and margarine”.
