## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 9 of 1952.

AN ORDINANCE to make special provision for the consideration by the Licensing Board for the County of Berbice, of certain applications for the renewal of spirit shop licences; and for matters connected therewith.

[ 21st June, 1952. ]

A.D. 1952. **BE IT ENACTED** by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

**Short title.** 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Berbice Licensing Board (Special Meeting) Ordinance, 1952.

**Interpre-  
tation.** 2. In this Ordinance —  
 “District Commissioner” means the District Commissioner of the Berbice District;

“Licensing Board” means the Licensing Board appointed for the County of Berbice under section six of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance.

3. Anything to the contrary contained in subsection (1) of section thirteen of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance notwithstanding, any application for the renewal of spirit shop licences made subsequent to the fifteenth day of October, 1951, by the licensees named and in respect of the premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto, shall be accepted by the District Commissioner.

Application by specified persons for renewal of Licence to be accepted by the District Commissioner.

4. For the purpose of dealing with the applications which may be accepted by the District Commissioner under the preceding section, the Licensing Board shall hold a special meeting on or before the eighteenth day of July nineteen hundred and fifty-two.

Special meeting of Licensing Board.

5. The Licensing Board shall give not less than forty-eight hours notice of the date and hour when, and the place where, the special meeting will be held in the *Gazette* and by exhibiting notices in conspicuous places at the Magistrate's Courts at Wel-daad, West Coast, Berbice, and at Whim, Corentyne, Berbice.

Notice of special meeting.

6. (1) Anything to the contrary contained in section nineteen of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance notwithstanding, the District Commissioner is hereby authorised, on payment of the duty prescribed by the Tax Ordinance, 1939, and subject to the provisions of this section, to issue a licence to each of the applicants named in the Schedule hereto if a certificate for the renewal of her or his spirit shop licence is granted by the Licensing Board at the special meeting to be held under the provision of section four of this Ordinance.

Authority of District Commissioner to issue Licence. Cap. 107. No. 43 of 1939. Schedule.

(2) For the purposes of this Ordinance only, section nineteen of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, as amended by section two of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, 1930, shall have effect as though the word "July" were substituted for the word "February" therein appearing.

7. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance the provisions of the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance shall, *mutatis mutandis*, apply in relation to the special meeting of the Licensing Board directed to be held by this Ordinance as it applies to a general annual meeting of the said Board and shall likewise apply to any subsequent act or procedure necessary to give effect to the granting of any application by the Board.

Provisions of Cap. 107 to apply to meeting of Licensing Board and to all subsequent procedure.

8. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect, the rights of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any other person or persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from, through or under them.
