## BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No. 20 OF 1955

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Pensions Ordinance, 1933.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

A.D. 1955

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be construed and read as one with the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the deletion of paragraph (e) and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph --

“(e) on termination of employment in the public interest as provided in this Ordinance.”

3. Section nine of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor --

“Termin-

ployment

interest.

9. Where an officer's service is terminated on the ground that, having regard to the conditions of the public service, the usefulness of the officer thereto and all the other circumstances of the case, such termination is desirable in the public interest, and a pension, gratuity or other allowance cannot otherwise be granted to him under the provisions of this Ordinance, the Governor in Council may, if he thinks fit, grant such pension, gratuity or other allowance as he thinks just and proper, not exceeding in amount that for which the officer would be eligible if he retired from the public service in the circumstances described in paragraph (d) of the preceding section.”
