BRITISH GUIANA

ORDINANCE No. 31 OF 1955

AN ORDINANCE to remove doubts as to the validity of certain Regulations made under the provisions of the Factories Ordinance, 1947.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Factories Regulations (Validation) Ordinance, 1955.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 31 of the Factories Ordinance, 1947, the Regulations set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid for all purposes as if they had been laid before the Legislative Council in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of section 31 of the Factories Ordinance, 1947, and had not, within the period of twenty-one days after they had been so laid, been annulled in the manner provided by subsection (2) of section 32 of the aforesaid Ordinance.
