BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE No.39 OF 1955

An Ordinance further to amend the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance in respect of Fraudulent Traders.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana: —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and shall be construed and read as one with the Summary Jurisdiction (Offences) Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section one hundred and one B of the Principal Ordinance as inserted by section two of the Summary Conviction Offences Ordinance, 1930, is hereby amended —

(a) by the substitution for subsection (1) of the following —

"(1) Every person who, when ordering in writing goods from within or without the Colony, makes, or causes to be made with intent to defraud.

which intent shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved, any false representation as to the name. nature, character or extent of the business which h∈ carries on, or as to his place of business or address or the means by which he can be communicated with, shall on being convicted thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months.";

(b) by the substitution for subsection (3) of the following -

"(3) There shall be exhibited to every

affidavit -

(a) the order for goods;

(b) any document which has been received by the person from whom the goods have been ordered and which purports to have come from the person ordering the goods and to refer or relate to such order "
