AN ORDINANCE to amend the Supreme Court Ordinance.

ENACTED by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1956.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supreme Court (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Supreme Court Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Subsection (1) of section 42 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition immediately after the word "jurisdictions" of the following words —
"or, if in any case the Chief Justice so directs, in the exercise of its civil jurisdiction".

Insertion of
new section
86A in Cap.

3. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion therein after section 86 of the following new section —

'Sitting of
Full Court
in more than
one division.

86A. The Full Court may, if the Chief Justice so directs, sit in more than one division at the same time, and in such case anything which may be done to, by or before the Full Court may be done to, by or before any such division of the Full Court."

Passed by the Legislative Council this twenty-sixth day of October, nineteen hundred and fifty-six.
