An Ordinance to amend the Interpretation Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

A.D. 1956.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Interpretation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Interpretation Ordinance and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. The Interpretation Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto immediately after section 39 the following additional section —

“Power of
Governor
in Council
to delegate
certain
powers.

40. Where by any Ordinance the Governor in Council is empowered to exercise any powers or perform any duties, the Governor in Council may by order depute any person by name, or the person for the time being holding the office designated by him, to exercise such powers or perform such duties on behalf of the Governor in Council, subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications, as the Governor in Council may prescribe, and thereupon or from the date specified by the Governor in Council, the person so deputed shall have and exercise such powers and perform such duties, subject as aforesaid :

Provided that nothing herein contained shall authorise the Governor in Council to depute any person to hear any appeal or to make regulations, rules or orders under the power in that behalf conferred upon the Governor in Council by any Ordinance.”

Passed by the Legislative Council this second day of November, nineteen hundred and fifty-six.
