Arrangement of Sections.

Section

1. Short Title.
2. Accountant General to defray expenses of Civil Government.

AN ORDINANCE to appropriate the supplies granted in the current session of the Legislative Council.

WHEREAS of the amount of forty-three million six hundred and ninety thousand six hundred and ninety-seven dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of this Colony, and for other purposes, for the year commencing the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, the sum of four million six hundred and sixty-two thousand eight hundred and sixty-

nine dollars has been provided for by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of the Colony of thirty-nine million twenty-seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight dollars:

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation (No. 2) Ordinance, 1956.

2. The Accountant General shall, on the warrant of the Governor, pay from the annual revenue of the year, commencing the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, and other resources of the Colony a sum not exceeding in the aggregate thirty-nine million twenty-seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight dollars as set forth in the schedule hereto for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government of the Colony, and for other purposes during the said year.
