AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Civil List Ordinance by increasing the amount which shall be payable to Her Majesty for defraying the expenses of certain services.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Civil List (Amendment No. 3) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Civil List Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the substitution for the words "fifty-three thousand and fifty" of the words "fifty-four thousand five hundred".

4. The schedule to the Principal Ordinance as substituted by section 4 of the Civil List (Amendment) Ordinance, 1955, and as amended from time to time is hereby further amended —

(a) by the substitution for the item "11 Magistrates on the scale £950 x £50 — £1450 .. 15,950" of the item "12 Magistrates on the scale £950 x £50 — £1450 .. 17,400";

(b) by the substitution for the total "£53,050" of the total "54,500".

5. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st January, 1957.
