AN ORDINANCE to amend the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1959, and shall be construed and read with the Motor Vehicles Insurance (Third Party Risks) Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. In section 2 of the Principal Ordinance, for the definition of the words "public road" there shall be substituted the following—

" 'public road' means any highway and any other road to which the public has access, and includes bridges over which a road passes, and any wharf, stelling or part of the foreshore to which the public has access;".

Amendment of  
section 3 of  
Chapter 281.

3. In subsection (4) of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance, after the word "service" there shall be inserted the words "or to any vehicle at any time when it is being driven for police purposes by or under the direction of a member of the police force or when it is being driven by a certifying officer in exercise of his duties under the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance".
