ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS.

Section

1. Short title.
2. Accountant General to defray expenses of Civil Government.

AN ORDINANCE to appropriate the supplies granted in the current session of the Legislative Council.

WHEREAS of the amount of forty-five million, eight hundred and ninety-two thousand five hundred and forty-seven dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes, for the year commencing the

first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, the sum of four million seven hundred and seventy-five thousand nine hundred and seventy-three dollars has been provided for by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of British Guiana of forty-one million one hundred and sixteen thousand and five hundred and seventy-four dollars :

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, 1958.

Accountant General to defray expenses of Civil Government.

2. The Accountant General shall, on the warrant of the Governor, pay from the annual revenue of the year, commencing on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, and other resources of British Guiana a sum not exceeding in the aggregate forty-one million one hundred and sixteen thousand and five hundred and seventy-four dollars as set forth in the schedule hereto for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes during the said year.
