2. Preservation of nurses' rights to retiring allowances.

AN ORDINANCE to preserve the rights of certain nurses to retiring allowances in respect of service in British Guiana prior to 1st January, 1954.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Nurses' Retiring Allowances (Preservation of Rights) Ordinance, 1958.

2. Notwithstanding the repeal by section 10 of the Nurses and Midwives Registration Ordinance, 1953, of Part VII of the Colonial Medical Service (Consolidation) Ordinance, published as Chapter 186 in the revised edition of the law of British Guiana prepared by Sir Charles Major under the Statute Law Revision Ordinance, 1926, section 63 of the said Colonial Medical Service (Consolidation) Ordinance shall be deemed to continue in force and to have effect as if it had been excluded from the operation of section 10 of the Nurses and Midwives Registration Ordinance, 1953, in respect of any nurse who but for the repeal of section 63 of the Colonial Medical Service (Consolidation) Ordinance aforesaid would have qualified for the grant of a retiring allowance by virtue of service *in a non-pensionable post* in British Guiana prior to the 1st January, 1954:

Provided that the retiring allowance granted to any such nurse shall be calculated at the rate of twenty shillings per annum for each month of her service under the Government of British Guiana and not at the rate of eight shillings and fourpence per annum for each such month of her service as was provided for in subsection (2) of section 63 of the Colonial Medical Service (Consolidation) Ordinance aforesaid.

Passed by the Legislative Council this third day of October, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
