AN ORDINANCE to amend the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Town Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same

2. Section 138 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after the words—

“four plots or pieces of Crown lands under the control of the Council situate, lying, and being to the west of the public buildings and the Demerara ice house, and between Hadfield Street on the south and Croal Street on the north;”

of the words —

“every shed constructed as a shelter for the use of persons waiting to join motor buses, furnished with seating accommodation for such persons and situated at a stopping place for motor buses indicated by a traffic sign prescribed by law for indicating such places, so long as the shed is furnished and situated as aforesaid;”

Passed by the Legislative Council this twenty-ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty.
