BRITISH GUIANA (INCORPORATION) ORDINANCE, 1964.

AN ORDINANCE to incorporate the Full Gospel Movement Streams of Power in British Guiana and for purposes connected therewith.

[20th June, 1964.]

A.D. 1964. Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Full Gospel Movement Streams of Power in British Guiana (Incorporation) Ordinance, 1964.

Interpretation. 2. In this Ordinance —

“the Executive Committee” means the Executive Committee of the Movement, appointed or elected in accordance with the constitution of the Movement;

“the Movement” means the Full Gospel Movement Streams of Power in British Guiana.

3. Johannes Franciscus Hoekendijk of Lot 160 Eping Avenue, Bel Air Park, East Coast Demerara, Dennis Nathaniel Hilliman of No. 79 Village, Queenstown, Corentyne, Berbice, Raman Singh of No. 63 Village, Corentyne, Berbice, and Lionel Cummings of No. 63 Village Corentyne, Berbice, being respectively the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Executive Committee and their successors in office, shall be a body corporate and shall have the name of the Executive Committee of the Full Gospel Movement Streams of Power in British Guiana, with perpetual succession and a common seal and power to sue and be sued.

Incorporation of the Executive Committee.

4. The Executive Committee shall have full power to purchase, accept by way of gift, legacy or devise, take, hold, enjoy, sell, transport, mortgage, lease, invest, and otherwise deal with and dispose of all property movable or immovable of whatever nature or kind soever.

Power to acquire and dispose of property.

5. No change in the membership of the Executive Committee shall derogate from the title or powers of the Executive Committee in respect of any property or any estate or interest vested in the Executive Committee.

Change of membership of the Executive Committee not to derogate from powers of the Executive Committee.

6. During the absence of any member of the Executive Committee or the refusal or inability of any member to act as such or the subsistence of any vacancy in the membership of the Executive Committee occasioned by the death of any member or otherwise, the surviving or remaining members may in the name of the Executive Committee exercise all or any of the powers conferred on the Executive Committee by this Ordinance.

Death or absence of member of the Executive Committee.

7. All property, movable or immovable of whatever nature or kind soever, heretofore and hereafter bequeathed or devised by will or otherwise given to the Movement in British Guiana shall be held by and is hereby vested in and shall be deemed to be the property of the Executive Committee.

Vesting of property.

8. All property vested in or hereafter acquired by the Executive Committee shall be held by the Executive Committee for the use and benefit of the Movement.

Tenure of property for use of the Movement.

9. A statement that any person named therein has been appointed a member of the Executive Committee, purporting to be signed by the President or Vice President and the Secretary of the Executive Committee shall be *prima facie* evidence of the said fact.

Evidence of appointment as member of Executive Committee.

10. All transports, mortgages, leases, transfers and assignments and all contracts or other documents relating to the movable or immovable property of the Movement and requiring to be formally executed by or on behalf of the Movement shall be deemed sufficiently executed if signed by the President for the time being of the Executive Committee.

Certain instruments to be signed by President.

11. All process which is required to be served on the Movement shall be deemed to be sufficiently served —

Service of process.

- (a) if a copy thereof is left with the President at the Headquarters of the said Movement within British Guiana or with an adult inmate at the place of residence in British Guiana of the President; or
- (b) if a copy thereof is published in the Gazette.

Power to  
make rules.

12. The Executive Committee may make rules not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance for the good government of the Movement.

Saving the  
rights of Her  
Majesty.

13. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to affect any right of Her Majesty the Queen, her heirs, and successors or any body politic or corporate, or any other person or persons except as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming, by, from, through or under them.
