BRITISH GUIANA.

AN ORDINANCE to incorporate certain persons as trustees of the body known as the United Sad'r Islamic Anjuman, to vest in such persons certain property and for purposes connected with the matters aforesaid.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the British Guiana United Sad'r Islamic Anjuman (Incorporation of Trustees) Ordinance, 1961.

Incorporation of Trustees.

2. Abdool Majeed, of 52 Brickdam and Boyle Place, Georgetown, A. D. Hack, of Charles Street, Charlestown, Georgetown, Abdool Moncer Khan, of Windsor Forest, West Coast, Demerara, S. M. Sha-koor, of Eccles, East Bank, Demerara, Haagi Ramjohn, of Skeldon, Corentyne, Berbice, the Deputy President and the Honorary Treasurer for the time being of the British Guiana United Sad'r Islamic Anjuman, and their successors in office as Trustees shall be and are hereby created a body corporate by the name of "The Incorporated Trustees of the British Guiana United Sad'r Islamic Anjuman" (hereinafter called "the Incorporated Trustees") and by that name shall have perpetual succession and may sue and be sued in all courts of justice.

Vesting of property in Trustees.

3. (1) All the property in British Guiana, movable or immovable, of what nature or kind soever, now held by or vested in the British Guiana United Sad'r Islamic Anjuman (hereinafter referred to as "the Anjuman") (of which immovable property a description is set forth in the schedule hereto), shall vest in and be held by the Incorporated Trustees.

Schedule.

(2) All property, movable or immovable, of what nature or kind soever, heretofore and hereafter bequeathed by will or otherwise given to the Anjuman shall be held by and is hereby vested in and shall be deemed to be the property of the Incorporated Trustees.

Trustees may acquire and dispose of property.

4. The Incorporated Trustees shall, subject to the rules or regulations of the Anjuman, have full power to purchase, take, hold, enjoy, transport, mortgage, lease, invest, and otherwise deal with and dispose of all the property movable and immovable of what nature or kind soever hereby vested in them or hereafter acquired by them.

Holding of properties for use of the Anjuman.

5. All property vested in or hereafter acquired by the Incorporated Trustees shall be held by them for the use and benefit of the Anjuman.

Evidence of appointment as Trustees.

6. In the event of the death, resignation, or absence from British Guiana of any Trustee or any change in the identity of the holder of the office of Deputy President or Honorary Treasurer of the Anjuman, a statement that any person has, in accordance with the rules or regulations of the Anjuman, been appointed in the place of the Trustee who has died or resigned or is absent as aforesaid or that any person is a Trustee by virtue of his becoming, in the course of such change, the holder of the office of Deputy President or Honorary Treasurer of the Anjuman, as the case may be, shall be *prima facie* evidence of the fact if the statement purports to be signed by a majority of the surviving or remaining Trustees.

7. In all legal proceedings in British Guiana against the Anjuman, service of process shall be deemed to be sufficient— Services of legal process.

- (a) if a copy thereof is left with each of two Trustees at any place within British Guiana; or
- (b) if a copy thereof is left with an adult inmate at the place of residence in British Guiana of each of two Trustees; or
- (c) if a copy thereof is published in the Gazette.

8. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to affect any right of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors or of any body politic or corporate or of any other person or persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance, and those claiming by, from, through or under them. Saving the rights of Her Majesty and others.

SCHEDULE

Firstly, the south half of the west half of lot number 157 (one hundred and fifty-seven), Alexanderville, in the Kitty and Alexanderville Village District, situate on the east sea coast of the county of Demerara, British Guiana, as shown on a diagram by J. P. Prass, Sworn Land Surveyor, dated the 24th March, 1888, and deposited in the office of the Registrar at Georgetown on the 24th November, 1888, with the buildings and erections thereon, and

Secondly, north half of west half of lot number 157 (one hundred and fifty-seven) Alexanderville, in the Kitty and Alexanderville Village District, situate on the east sea coast of the county of Demerara, British Guiana, as shown on a diagram by J. P. Prass, Sworn Land Surveyor, dated 24th March, 1888, and deposited in the office of the Registrar of British Guiana on the 24th November, 1888, no building thereon.

Passed by the Legislative Council this seventeenth day of May, nineteen hundred and sixty-one.
