AN ORDINANCE to amend the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce Ordinance.

A.D. 1961. Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce (Amendment) Ordinance, 1961, and shall be construed and read with the Georgetown Chamber of Commerce Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

Cap. 200. 2. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor —

Repeal and re-enactment of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance.

“Constitution of Council.

5.(1) There shall be a Council of the Chamber which shall consist of the president, two vice-presidents, the treasurer, the secretary and 16 other members of the Chamber.

(2) Subject to any rules for the time being in force under section 11 of this Ordinance prescribing a quorum of the Council, the Council shall not be disqualified for the transaction of business by reason of any vacancy in its membership, including any vacancy not filled when the Council is reconstituted at any time.”

Special general meeting to fill vacancies.

3. The secretary is hereby vested with the authority and required to convene a special general meeting of the Chamber within two months of the coming into force of this Ordinance for the purpose of filling the vacancies in the membership of the Council created by the increase in membership provided for by section 2 of this Ordinance.

Saving the rights of Her Majesty.

4. Nothing herein contained shall affect, or be deemed to affect the rights of Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors, or of any body politic or corporate or of any other person or persons except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from, through or under them.

Passed by the Legislative Council this twenty-ninth day of June, nineteen hundred and sixty-one.
