

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Criminal Law (Procedure) Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1961.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Criminal Law (Procedure) Short title. (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1961, and shall be construed and read with the Criminal Law (Procedure) Ordinance, hereinafter re- Chap. 11. ferred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Amendment of section 5 of Chapter 11.

2. The proviso to subsection (2) of section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after the words "the first day of the sitting of the Court," of the words "or at any time during the said sitting of the Court,".

Amendment of section 32A of Chapter 11.
No. 22 of 1961.

- 3. The Principal Ordinance shall, from the coming into operation of section 4 of the Criminal Law (Procedure) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1961, be deemed to be amended as if in the said section 4, the following subsection had been substituted for subsection (2) of section 32A—
 - "(2) Written notice of an intention to make an application under the preceding subsection shall be given by the party intending to make the application to the other party and to the Registrar not later than three days before the first day of the sitting of the Court, and where any cause has been added to the list by virtue of the provisions of subsection (2) of section 5 of this Ordinance, written notice of an intention to make an application aforesaid shall be given to the other party and to the Registrar not later than four days after the date of publication in the Gazette of a notice of the addition of any such cause to the list."
