1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1963, and shall be construed and read with the Summary Jurisdiction (Procedure) Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.
