AN ORDINANCE to amend the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance, 1956.

[7th December, 1963]

A.D. 1963. Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

Short title and commencement.

1.(1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons (Amendment) Ordinance, 1963, and shall be construed and read with the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance, 1956, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

(2) This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 21st December, 1957.

Amendment of section 48 of the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 48 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end of the section and the addition thereto of the following proviso :—

“Provided that the Chemists and Druggists (Training and Examination) Regulations made under the aforesaid Ordinance shall, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, continue in force until revoked by rules made under this Ordinance.”
