ORDINANCE NO. 10 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance, Chapter 34, with respect to the duty on precious stones exported from the Colony.

A.D. 1933.
—

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1933, and shall be construed with the Customs Duties Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section twenty of the Principal Ordinance, as amended by section two of the Customs Duties Ordinance, 1931, is hereby amended by substituting the following for paragraph (a) thereof:—

“(a) A duty of fifty cents on every carat by weight of precious stones exported from the Colony: provided that the duty on precious stones which in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands and Mines are unsuitable for use as gems and can only be used for industrial purposes shall be fifteen cents the carat.”
