ORDINANCE NO. // OF 1934.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Deeds Registry Ordinance, Chapter 177, by making provision for the performance by a first-class clerk of the duties of the Registrar during his temporary absence from the Deeds Registry.

A.D. 1934.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Deeds Registry Ordinance, 1934, and shall be construed with the Deeds Registry Ordinance and any amending Ordinance.


Short Title.

When Registrar is temporarily absent from the Deeds Registry, a first class clerk shall have the duties and powers of the Registrar.

2. During the temporary absences of the Registrar from the Deeds Registry an officer being a first class clerk sworn clerk and notary public may do any act or thing which may lawfully be done by the Registrar: provided that this section shall not authorise the officer

- (a) to pass or execute any transport, mortgage, cancelment of mortgage, lease or other document which may be passed and executed by the Registrar, or
- (b) to do any act or thing which the Registrar may in writing from time to time direct shall not be done by an officer aforesaid.
