ORDINANCE NO. 23 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE to allow and confirm certain additional expenditure incurred in the year ended thirty-first day of December, 1932.

A.D. 1933.

WHEREAS expenditure was necessarily incurred during the year ended on the thirty-first day of December, 1932, on certain services approved by the Legislative Council on Supplementary Estimate but not provided for by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1932 :

Be it, therefore, enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1932) Ordinance, 1933. Short Title.


