ORDINANCE NO. 24 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance, Chapter 34, by inserting therein a definition of the term "The British Empire."

A.D. 1933.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—


1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties Ordinance (No. 2), 1933, and shall be construed with the Customs Duties Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same. Short Title.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following sub-section :—

"(3) In this section the expression "the British Empire" means the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Dominions, India, the territories administered by His Majesty's Governments in the Dominions under Mandate or otherwise, the British Colonies, the British Protectorates and protected States, and the Mandated Territories of Tanganyika, the Cameroons under British Mandate and Togoland under British Mandate."
