ORDINANCE NO. 29 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Customs Duties Ordinance, Chapter 34, with respect to the duty on Edible Oil.

A.D. 1933.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties Ordinance, (No. 3) 1933, and shall be construed with the Customs Duties Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any amending Ordinance.


