BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 33 OF 1934.

AN ORDINANCE to continue certain expiring laws.

A.D. 1984.

WHEREAS the Ordinances mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance were temporary in their duration, and limited to expire, as on the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-two;

AND WHEREAS the operation of the said Ordinances was extended to the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-four;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient further to extend the operation of the said Ordinances:

Be it, therefore, enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

Short Title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Expiring Laws Continuance Ordinance, 1934.

Continuance of Ordinances in Schedule to 31st December, 1935. 2. The Ordinances mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be continued until and including the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-five.

1. The Sugar (Temporary) Excise Duty Ordinance, 1932 (No. 2).
2. The Bill of Entry Tax Ordinance, 1932 (No. 8).
