BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 41 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Molasses (Disposal) Ordinance, 1931. with respect to information to be given on the delivery of Molasses.

RE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Molasses (Disposal) Ordin- Short Title. ance, 1933, and shall be construed with the Molasses (Disposal) Ordinance, 1931, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Before the delivery of molasses to any person under sections two and three of the Principal Ordinance, such person shall state in

required to be in writing. writing signed by him the purpose for which he desires to obtain the molasses. The statement shall be delivered to and kept by the person who delivers the molasses and shall be open to inspection in the same manner and by the same persons mentioned in sub-section (2) of section two of the Principal Ordinance.

Certificate under sec. 3 (2) of No. 23 of 1931. 3. Every certificate delivered under sub-section (2) of section three of the Principal Ordinance shall state the purpose for which the molasses has been obtained.

Penalty for use other than that given. 4. Any person to whom molasses has been delivered under the Principal Ordinance and who uses it or any part thereof for a purpose other than that set forth in the statement required by section two and in the certificate delivered under section three of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars.

Amendment of sec. 2 (3) of No. 23 of 1931.

Copy of statement delivered under sec. 2 to be sent to Chief Commissary and Inspector-General,

- 5. Sub-section (3) of section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting the words "and the Inspector-General of Police" after the word "Commissary" in the third line.
- 6.—(1) Every person who transmits an extract of entries in pursuance of sub-section (3) of section two of the Principal Ordinance shall at the same time transmit to the same officers a copy of every statement which has been delivered during the preceding month under section two of this Ordinance.
- (2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be liable to the penalty provided by sub-section (1) of section four of the Principal Ordinance.
