BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 29 OF 1934.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, with respect to the regulations for the computation of pensions for officers with other public service.

A.D. 1934.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Pensions Ordinance, (No. 2), 1934, and shall be construed with the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934.



2. The following is hereby substituted for the first proviso to paragraph three of regulation nineteen of the Pensions Regulations 1933, in the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance, as enacted by section four of the Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934 :—

“ Provided that in calculating the aggregate amount of his pensionable emoluments no account shall be taken of any service under any Scheduled Government which does not grant the officer a pension or gratuity, or of any period of leave without salary or with salary at a special rate which was granted to him in order to make continuous service interrupted either by abolition of office or in consequence of a reorganization designed to effect greater efficiency and economy.”

Passed by the Legislative Council this 5th day of September, 1934.
