BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 34 OF 1933.

AN ORDINANCE to authorise the making of Orders in Council for the purpose of effecting economies in expenditure with respect to the remuneration of persons in the Public Service.

A.D. 1933.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Service Economy Ordinance, 1933. Short Title.

2.—(1) During the period of one month after the commencement of this Ordinance the Governor may, in respect of the remuneration (other than by way of pension) of persons in the Public Service of the Colony, make such Orders in Council as appear to him to be expedient for the purposes of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of moneys provided by the Civil List

Ordinance or any other Ordinance or out of moneys provided by the Legislative Council, and an Order may make provision for the modification or termination of statutory or contractual rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect.

(2) Any Order in Council made under this section, shall, as from such date not earlier than the first day of January nineteen hundred and thirty-four as may be specified in the Order, have effect notwithstanding anything in any enactment.
