ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1930.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Cinematograph Ordinance, 1912, A.D. 1930.
Amendment Ordinance, 1916, with respect to the opening of
premises for entertainment on Sundays.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice
and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—


1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cinematograph Ordinance, Short Title,
1930, and shall be construed with the Cinematograph Ordinance,
1912, Amendment Ordinance, 1916, hereinafter referred to as the No. 7 of
Principal Ordinance 1916.

2. Sub-section (12) of section three of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

“(12) A licence under sub-section (1) hereof shall not authorise the licensee to open the premises for the purpose of any entertainment before the hour of half past eight of the clock in the afternoon on a Sunday or at any time on Good Friday.”
