ORDINANCE NO. 6. OF 1930.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Registration of Births and Deaths Ordinance, 1868, with respect to the burial of still-born children. A.D. 1930.
--

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Births and Deaths Ordinance, 1930, and shall be construed with the Registration of Births and Deaths Ordinance, 1868, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same. Short Title.

2 Sub-section (2) of section sixty of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after the word 'child' in the sixth line of paragraph (a) thereof the words 'or, in the event of no licensed medical practitioner being readily available, then a certificate of a Government dispenser, duly authorised for the purpose by the Surgeon-General.'

3. Sub-section (1) of section sixty-one of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the words 'of a medical practitioner' in the fifth line thereof."


4. Section sixty-three of the Principal Ordinance, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

" Fee for
viewing body
of still-born
child.

63.—(1) Where a registered medical practitioner is applied to by any person to view the body of any child alleged to have been still-born and to give a certificate under this Ordinance and such person is unable to pay any fee, the medical practitioner may, with the sanction of the Governor, receive from any money granted for the contingent expenses of Justice a fee of one dollar for viewing the body.

(2) Where such a certificate as is referred to in section sixty can be properly given by the medical practitioner, such fee shall include the granting of such certificate."
