## BRITISH GUIANA.

[THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.]

ORDINANCE NO. 15 OF 1930.

AN ORDINANCE to regulate the retail price of Sugar within the Colony. A.D. 1930.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sugar (Regulation of Short Title. Prices) Ordinance, 1930.

Fixing of  
Retail  
Prices.      2. The Governor may whenever in his opinion the circumstances require by proclamation published in the *Gazette* fix the maximum prices for which the various grades of sugar manufactured in the Colony may be sold by retail and may at any time revoke, alter or amend any such proclamation.

Penalty.      3. Any person selling sugar in excess of such maximum retail prices so fixed as aforesaid shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five dollars for every such offence.
