INTRODUCTION

The year 2004 can be described as a hectic one for the National Advisory Council on Occupational Safety and Health. Activities conducted included Meetings, Lectures, Workplace Inspections, Seminars, Media Briefing, an Award Ceremony and a Farewell function.

MEETINGS

Fourteen (14) meetings were held for the year. Eleven (11) of these were Statutory. Meetings were held regularly during the first quarter to facilitate preparations for the observance of Occupational Safety and Health Day and Month of activities in April, 2004 under the Theme: "Sustaining a Safety and Health Culture at Work".

Lectures:

Several lectures were delivered at Institutions of Higher Education such as the twelve-week Workplace Health and Safety Practice Certificate Course at the Institute of Distance and Continuing Education (IDCE) and the twelve-week Environmental Management Course at the Consultative Association of Guyanese Industry (CAGI).

Workplace Inspections:

Workplace Inspections were conducted at organizations that applied for awards to ensure that the requirements for such Awards were met.

Seminars:

Seminars were held at the Caricom Rice Mills, Anna Regina, Essequibo and at the Watooka Club, Linden.

Media Briefing:

A Media Briefing was held at the Boardroom of the Guyana Trades Union Congress, Woolford Avenue. Mr. Andrew Garnett, Chairman, advised the media on the planned activities for the Month of April.

Award Ceremony:

An Annual Award Ceremony was held on the 28th April at the Hotel Tower, Main Street, Georgetown. The Award Scheme was intended to recognize and reward companies/workplaces that satisfied established bench-marks in keeping with their corporate responsibility for Safety and Health at Work, during the year 2003. Individual Awards were also given to persons who made significant contributions to the development of Occupational Safety and Health in Guyana.
