An Act to amend the Expulsion of Undesirables Ordinance.

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

4 (2) 1967

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Expulsion of Undesirables Short Title. (Amendment) Act, 1967, and shall be construed and read as one with the Expulsion of Undesirables Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Cap. 99. Principal Ordinance, and any amendments thereto.
- 2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution for the definition of "undesirable person" of the following of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance.

- "undestrable person" means any person, other than a citizen of Guyana, in respect of whom the Governor-General deems it conducive to the public good to make an expulsion order:'
- 3. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed.

4. Subsection (1) of section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "other".

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to apply the Expulsion of Undesirables Ordinance to all persons who are not citizens of Guyana, whether they are British subjects or not, while confining the criteria for making an expulsion order under the Ordinance to the public good.
