Intituled

AN ACT to amend certain e actmen relating to Local Authorities and to validate the appoint ent an acts of certain persons who purported to exercise the nction of members of those authorities.

Enacted by the Parliam nt of Guyana:-

Short title

This, Act may be cited as the Local Authorities (Validation of Appointment and Acts of Members) Act, 1969.

Inter-pretation.

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires "Board" means the Local Government Board;

"the Ordinance" means the Local Government (Postponement of Elections) Ordinance, 1961;

Amendment of section 3 of the Local Govern-ment (Post-ponement of Elec-tions) Ordinance,

Section 3 of the Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after the word "Board" of the brackets and word "(although he does not possess all of the qualifications prescribed by section 32 of the Principal Ordinance)".

Amendment of section 72 of Chapter

- Section 72 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended 4. in the following respects -
 - (a) by the deletion of the words "and shall vacate office two years thereafter" from subsection (4) and the substitution therefor of the words "or on such other date as the Board may direct; they shall vacate office on 31st December in the year next ensuing the year in which they were appointed"; and
 - (b) by the substitution of a comma for the full stop after the word "district" in subsection (6) and the addition thereafter of the words "and any person becoming a member of a country authority by virtue of an increase in the membership thereof under this sub-

section shall vacate office at the same time as those members of the country authority who assumed office in accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of this section."

5. (1) The almendment effected by section 3 of this Act shall be Validation deemed to have come into operation at the commencement of the Ordinance:

Provided that no proceedings shall be instituted against —

- (a) the Board or a village council for having declared the office of a member of a village council to be vacant between the commencement of the Ordinance and this Act and which declaration would, but for the aforesaid amendment, have been lawfully made;
- (b) the Board for having filled the office so declared vacant;
- (c) any person for having assumed and performed the functions of the office of a member of a village countil on the nomination of the Board.
- (2) All adts done in good faith as a member of a village council by a person referred to in paragraph (c) of the proviso to subsection (1) of this section are hereby declared in all respects to have been validly, properly and lawfully done.
- (3) Any member of a country authority who, prior to the enactment of this Act, assumed office as such member on a date other than the 1st January after his appointment shall, notwithstanding that section 4 of this Act had not been in force be deemed to have validly assumed office.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

In 1961, elections to membership of village councils were suspended by the Local Government (Postponement of Elections) Ordinance, 1961, in preparation for the introduction of local government reform. Section 3 of the Ordinance continued in office those vllage councillors who were then in office but empowered the Local Government Board to fill any vacancy by nomination and the person so nominated was deemed to have been elected to membership of the village council under the Local Government Ordinance. The operation of the provisions of the Local Government Ordinance providing for the vacation of office by village councilors was not, however, suspended. There have been instances where persons who were not qualified to be village councillors in accordance with section 32 of the Local Government Ordinance (which *inter alia* requires a councillor to be a registered voter) were nominated o fill vacancies on village councils. However, the provisions of sec ion 32 of the Local Government Ordinance could not have been compled with because the registers of voters in village districts have not een revised since 1961 and no such registers are in force.

It is the G vernment's policy that local government elections should be based on adult suffrage and that for such time as elections to membership o village councils remain suspended, vacancies on those councils could a so be filled by persons who under the existing law do not possess lof the qualifications for election to membership of village councils, for example, the requirement of being a proprietor. Clause 3 of the ill, therefore, seeks to amend section 3 of the Local Government (Po tponement of Elections) Ordinance, 1961, to provide that a person m y be nominated by the Local Government Board to fill a vacancy o a village council although he may not possess all of the qualification required by section 32 of the Local Government Ordinance.

Section 72 of the Local Government Ordinance (Chapter 150) provides for courtry authorities to be constituted. Section 72(4) provides for the members constituting the authority to assume office on the 1st Januar after appointment and to vacate office two years thereafter. It his occurred that some persons who were appointed as members of color try authorities assumed office otherwise than in accordance with section 72 (4) of the Local Government Ordinance. Clause 4 of the ill therefore seeks to authorise the Local Government

Board to direct that a person who as been appointed as a member of a country authority shall assume office on a date other than the 1st January after his appointment. This provision will enable the Board to increase the number of m bers of a country authority at any time if it is considered desirabl.

Class so f the Bill seeks to pr vide validating provisions consequent of the amendments contained 1 clauses 3 and 4.
