Bill No. 12 of 1962. APPROPRIATION BILL, 1962.

Arrangement of Sections.

Section

1. Short title.

Accountant General to defray expenses of Civil Government. Schedule.

> A BILL Intituled

An Ordinance to appropriate the supplies granted in the current session of the Legislature.

WHEREAS of the amount of sixty-five million, five hundred and forty-four thousand, four hundred and sixty-nine dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes, for the year commencing the first day of January, nineteen nundred and sixty-two, the sum of six million, five hundred and ninetyfour thousand, and ten dollars is chargeable by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of British Guiana of fifty-eight million, nine hundred and fifty thousand, four hundred and fifty-nine dollars:

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana: -

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance. Short title.

2. The Accountant General shall, on the warrant of the Governor Accountant General to or the Minister of Finance, pay from the annual revenue of the year, defray excommencing on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-two, penses of Civil Govand other resources of British Guiana a sum not exceeding in the aggre-ernment. gate fifty-eight million, nine hundred and fifty thousand, four hundred Schedule. and fifty-nine dollars as set forth in the schedule hereto for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes during the said year.
