INSTRUMENT APPOINTING A MEMBER OF THE
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) of Article 94 of the Constitution of British Guiana that there shall be in and for British Guiana a Public Service Commission which shall consist of a Chairman and such number of other members, not being less than two nor more than four, as the Governor, acting in his discretion, may from time to time decide;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (2) of the said Article 94 that the members of the Public Service Commission shall be appointed by the Governor, acting after consultation with the Prime Minister, by instrument under the Public Seal;

AND WHEREAS it is provided in paragraph (5) of the said Article that the office of a member of the Public Service Commission shall become vacant at the expiration of five years from the date of his appointment or such earlier time as may be specified in the instrument by which he was appointed;

AND WHEREAS by instrument under the Public Seal of the 25th day of October, 1965, JAMES AUGUSTUS AGARD, ESQUIRE, M.B.E., was appointed to be a member of the Public Service Commission until the expiration of the 28th February, 1966.

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said provisions, and after consultation with the Prime Minister, I do hereby appoint JAMES AUGUSTUS AGARD, ESQUIRE, M.B.E., to be a member of the Public Service Commission until the expiration of the 25th May, 1966.
