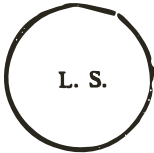

INSTRUMENT APPOINTING A PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY.

WHEREAS it is provided by paragraph (1) of article 43 of the Constitution of Guyana that the Governor-General, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister, may appoint Parliamentary Secretaries from among members of the National Assembly to assist Ministers in the discharge of their functions:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said provisions and by virtue and in exercise of all other powers enabling me in that behalf I do hereby appoint Philip Duncan Esquire, M.P., to be a Parliamentary Secretary to assist the Minister of Local Government in the discharge of the responsibilities for Amerindian Affairs assigned to him in pursuance of article 36 of the said Constitution.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of Guyana, at Guyana House, Georgetown, this 31st day of August, 1966, and in the fifteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
