Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

Short title.
Cap. 11:06

1. This Act, which amends the Training Schools Act, may be cited as the Training Schools (Amendment) Act 2010.

2. Section 20 (1) of the Principal Act is amended –

(a) by the deletion of the words beginning with “to be” and ending with the word “or”;

(b) by the substitution for the colon of a full stop; and

(c) by the deletion of the proviso.

Amendment of
section 25 of

Act.

3. Section 25 of the Principal Act is amended –

(a) by the deletion of the comma immediately after the word “training”;

(b) by the deletion of the words beginning with “or permit him” and ending with the words “Guyana Youth Corps.”.

Repeal of
sections 26

4. The Principal Act is amended by the repeal of sections 26 and 27.

5. The Schedule to the Principal Act is amended by the deletion of Forms 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The proposed amendments to the Training Schools Act Cap. 11:06 provide for the deletion of archaic provisions within the said Act, including the provision relating to maintenance of persons detained at established institutions pursuant to an order of the Magistrate.
