Intituled

AN ACT to amend the Transport and Harbours Ordinance.

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:-

A.D. 1970

1. This Act may be cited as the Transport and Harbours Short title (Amendment) Act, 1970, and amends the Transport and Harbours Ordi- Cap. 261. nance.

Amendment

Subsection (3) of section 6 of the Principal Ordinance is 6 of Chapter hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "two years from the date of his appointment" the date of his appointment" and by the substitution therefor of the words "any period not exceeding two years".

Validation

Any appointment made under subsection (3) of section 6 of the Principal Ordinance prior to the commencement of this Act in purported exercise of the power conferred by virtue of section 2 shall be deemed to have been validly made.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Subsection (3) of section 6 of the Transport and Harbours Ordinance (Chapter 261) provides that the members of the Advisory Council shall hold office for two years. Subsection (11) of Section 6 of the Ordinance makes provision for appointments to be made to the Council to fill vacancies and for any person so appointed to hold office for the unexpired portion of his predecessor's term of office. It is considered that subsection (3) of section 6 of the Ordinance should be amended to enable the appointing authority to appoint members of the Council for a shorter period, if necessary, and this Bill seeks to make provision for that purpose.

Clause 3 seeks to make provision validating previous appointments which have been made for periods of less than two years.
