BILL NO. 33 OF 1970

APPROPRIATION (No. 2) BILL, 1970.

Arrangement of Sections.

Short title.

Issue from the Consolidated Fund authorised.

Appropriations Schedule.

A BILL

Intituled

AN ACT to provide for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum necessary to meet the expenditure (not otherwise lawfully charged on the Consolidated Fund) of Guyana for the financial year ending 31st December, 1971, estimates whereof have been approved by the National Assembly, and for appropriation of that sum for specified purposes, in conformity with the Constitution.

A.D. 1970

Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana :—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (No. 2) Act, 1970.

Issue from
the Consoli-
dated Fund
authorised.

2. The Accountant General may, on the warrant of the Minister, issue from the Consolidated Fund a sum not exceeding in the aggregate the gross amount of one hundred and eighty-six million, two hundred and seventeen thousand, one hundred and thirty-nine dollars for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Government and for other purposes for the financial year ending on the 31st December, 1971, and before that date the appropriate accounting officers shall pay in to the Accountant General for deposit into the Consolidated Fund, the sums totalling four million, four hundred thousand, nine hundred and ninety-eight dollars shown as appropriations-in-aid in the last column of the schedule, thereby making the issue from the Consolidated Fund to meet expenditure for the financial year, not exceeding in the aggregate the net sum of one hundred and eighty-one million, eight hundred and sixteen thousand, one hundred and forty-one dollars.

3. The net sum granted in section 2 is hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the schedule pursuant to and in accordance with Article 111(2) of the Constitution with effect from 1st January, 1971.
